Primary Function and Purpose

The statutory requirements of Chapter 36.80 RCW are assigned to the County Engineer to report through the Director of the Department of Public Works. The County Engineer must be a licensed professional civil engineer, and be responsible for the planning, administration, and coordination of all engineering and associated activities related to county roads. Work of this class involves the exercise of considerable independent judgment and discretion in the interpretation, application, and enforcement of laws, regulations, and county policies applicable to road design, construction, and maintenance activities; the supervision of professional and operational support personnel; and the conduct of considerable coordination with other county departments, other governmental agencies, and the public as a part of the overall public relations function inherent in this type of organization. Assignments involve full responsibility for final decisions and results in all technical engineering and operational matters, restricted only by legal and statutory limitations and policies established by the Board of County Commissioners. Meetings are held frequently with engineering supervisory personnel in order to ensure the installation, clarification, and execution of desired programs. Work is performed under the general direction of the Public Works Director and is reviewed through meetings, reports, and an evaluation of results obtained.
